# RULES.

A NUMBER of persons in and about Glasgow agreed, Preamble.  
upon the twenty-second day of August, 1791, to  
unite themselves under the title of the "GLASGOW  
GALLOWAY BROTHERLY SOCIETY." Certain regulations  
were then adopted for the government of the Society,  
and have been altered and amended from time to time.  
The Society is entitled to all the privileges and benefits  
conferred by the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, and acts 50 and 60 Vict.,  
cap. 75.  
amending the same.

The following are the Rules and Regulations of the  
Society, as revised and confirmed at a General Meeting  
held on 25th November, 1889, and amended as regards  
benefits at a General Meeting held on 30th April, 1917.

## I.

The Society shall be called the "GLASGOW GALLOWAY Name, Objects,  
and Registered  
Office of the  
Society.  
BROTHERLY SOCIETY," and shall consist of ordinary and  
honorary members. Its objects are hereby declared to  
be to provide and secure a fund, out of which certain  
allowances shall be made to the ordinary members of  
the Society during sickness and infirmity; and from  
which a sum of money shall be paid on the death of any  
such member towards his funeral expenses; and to these  
purposes, and the necessary expenses of management  
and of promoting the Society's interest, the whole funds  
shall be exclusively applied. The Society's Registered  
Office is at 173 St. Vincent Street, Glasgow, and notice  
of any change in the situation of the Registered Office  
shall be sent, within 14 days thereafter, to the Registrar  
in manner and form provided by the Treasury Regu-  
lations in that behalf.
